**TWO NEW YORK MEN CHARGED  
WITH ILLEGAL TRANSPORTATION OF ALCOHOL**

**Suspects and Charge Information:**

**Fang Zheng, 32, and Gen Fa Ma, 54, both of New York, were charged with:**

- Illegal transportation of Alcoholic Liquor
- Illegal transportation of Alcoholic Liquor by other than a manufacturer or importer
- Conspiracy 3<sup>rd</sup>

**Date of Arrest:** January 26, 2012

**Location:** Route 40, Newark, DE

On January 26, Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement (DATE) Agents arrested two New York men who are accused of illegally transporting alcohol across state lines. Following a tip, the DATE investigation revealed large quantities of alcoholic beverages, at an Elkton, Md. liquor store, were being loaded into a small box truck from New York. DATE Agents and Delaware State Troopers stopped the vehicle on Route 40 in Newark. DATE Agents searched the vehicle and seized 168 cases alcohol including an assortment of beer and wine, a small amount of cash and the truck. Investigation revealed the men were headed to New York to sell the products. The estimated value of the alcohol is \$4,500.

The men were arraigned and held on \$3,460 cash bond. Both were incarcerated at Young Correctional facility.
